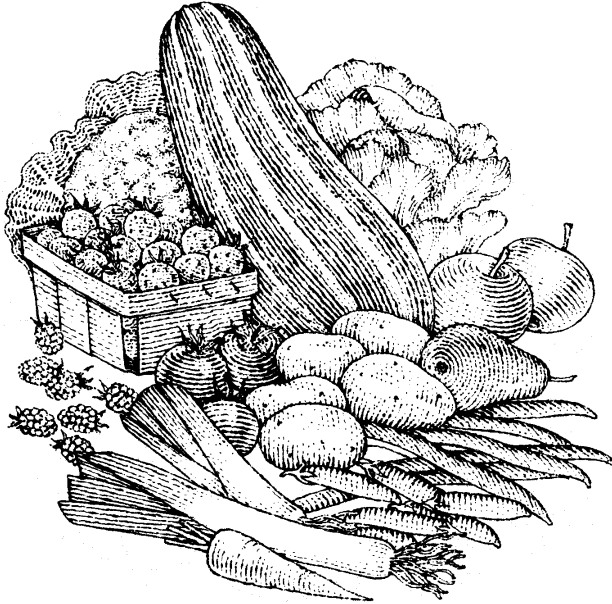

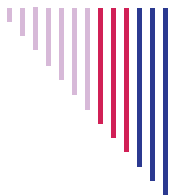

SET RECIPE – STICKY DATE CAKE

110g raisins	150g plain flour
225g chopped dates	275ml water
175g sultanas	pinch of salt
110g currants	½ teaspoon of bicarb
275g butter	heaped tablespoon of marmalade
1 x 400g tin condensed milk	blanched almonds
150g wholemeal flour	glace cherries

Grease and line a 20cm / (approx) tin

Put the raisins, dates, sultanas and currants into a saucepan with the butter, condensed milk and water

Bring to the boil and simmer for 3 mins stirring continuously

Pour the mixture into a large bowl and allow to cool

Preheat the oven to 170 °C / gas mk 3

In another bowl mix together the flours, with the salt and bicarb

Once the fruit mixture is cool fold it into the flour and stir in the marmalade.

Spoon the mixture into the greased tin and decorate with blanched almonds and cherries

Place a double layer of baking parchment over the top and bake for approx 1½ hrs

2. In the flower and vegetable sections the entries must have been grown in the exhibitors own garden
3. NO entry fees and NO cash prizes for adults. Children's prizes are 1st (50p), 2nd (30p), and 3rd (20p).
4. The judges decision is final, and the right to withhold any award is reserved.
5. NO exhibit is to be staged unless an entry is made on the official entry form and is handed in by midday **Wednesday 25th August**.
6. Only one entry by an exhibitor to be staged in a class.
7. NO two (2) exhibitors to join their entries together.
8. NO entries to be removed before 4:00 pm.
9. Exhibits to be staged between 9:00 am and 11:00 am. Only exhibitors to be allowed in the hall.
10. Judging will commence at 11:00 am when the hall will be cleared except for the judges.
11. NO professionals to exhibit the products of their trade.
12. Entrants in the children's section must be under fourteen (14) years of age on the date of the show
13. The committee will NOT be held responsible for any loss, damage to, or wrongly staged exhibits.
14. All cups awarded in the previous year must be returned by August 15th.

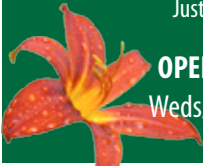
