Planning applications which were supported were Rose Cottage, Polyphant, listed building consent for the erection of a replacement shed: 10 Medrow, Alterations and demolition of existing garage and erection of extensions to existing bungalow. We have written to NDCD requesting a site meeting regarding the erection of a hydrotherapy unit at Bowden Derra prior to making our comments. We had invoices for payment for David Eno (newsletter) £35, BJV Cleaning of bus shelter £22, Perfect Pastures £723.80 (grass maintenance) and £129.25 for the maintenance of our footpaths.

## Whitmans weather

Well here we are at the end of another 'Weather Year' (although it's actually Christmas Eve as I put finger to keyboard) and it's dry! I'll settle for more of that please as we enter 2006!

Perhaps someone out there has made a New Year's Resolution to afford more support to their Parish Newsletter by taking over this regular weather spot. I would be delighted to hear from you whoever you are!!

Back to the plot! What can I report of interest about the weather during the last month and over the year as a whole?

Well, to start with, my records show that the last 30 days have been equally divided between wet and dry. The rainfall for the period has totalled just less than 4.5 inches which surprisingly but interestingly, is exactly the same as in April and August.

The total rainfall for 2005 is a mere 49.75 inches which is noticeably less than the annual average of 54 inches over the last five years. 2001 was right on the button at 54 inches whilst 2002 was a little on the damp side at 66.5 inches! 2003 on the other hand was remarkably dry at only 40.5 inches with the figure climbing back up to 58.5 inches for 2004.

So what can we deduce from these statistics? (All answers on a postcard please to the Editor!) Personally, I'm not sure, other than to say that the weather in Cornwall is unpredictable and that 2005 hasn't been too bad after all then?

As for 2006; well the foregoing pattern would suggest that we could be in for another wet one, which reminds me - I must order a new pair of wellies !!!
