LEWANNICK PARISH COUNCIL

Lewannick Parish Council met On Wednesday 15 February at Lewannick Village Hall. The meeting commenced at 8pm and was open to the public.

We have received correspondence from our MP Dan Rogerson in which he is ...holding the Highways Agency to their promise that they will send a representative to meet our community, they are presently reconsidering their plans. The Highways Agency have written ..."they confirm that their Managing Agents, Parsons Brickerhoff, have been asked to review the safety improvement proposals in the new financial year, subject to funding, and to make recommendations accordingly" ... The Highways Agency will not be in a position to consult again with us until they are content that the recommendations represent the most appropriate solution to reduce potential for accidents and to improve traffic safety on the A30 at Two Bridges.

CCC have produced an Annual Minerals and Waste Monitoring Report for 2004/05. The Report looks at a variety of issues relating to minerals and waste in the County. In particular it looks at the impact of minerals working and waste management facilities on the environment and local amenity, the use of local plan policies in decision making and the monitoring and enforcement of mineral and waste sites. We have requested a copy of

the Report in order that we can continue to monitor the impact of mineral workings at Blackhill.

The planning applications received for discussion were:

Listed Building Consent for the demolition of outbuilding in curtilage of a Listed Building – ROSE COTTAGE, POLYPHANT – MR I McCUTCHEON No 2006/00100 - We supported this application.

4 MEDROW, POLYPHANT – Mr and Mrs P Frier. Erection of new two bedroom attached bungalow. No 2006/00195. We have not supported this application - Housing – Local Plan Objectives 3.9, 3.20, Policy HSG3 3.38, South West Water letter dated 24 August 2004 confirming that there are no definite proposals in their Capital Plan and that significant works have yet to be undertaken to the sewerage infrastructure in our area before any further connections to the existing system are granted. The proposed application is to connect to a sewage pipe privately owned by the Householders on the north side of Medrow. The proposed vehicular access would be on a dangerously narrow road. The Design Guide covers 'building in context' – the design of a semi-detached dwelling is completely out of keeping with the rest of the village. The plot is too small for development, the removal of an established Cornish bank and damage to a

tree with TPO restrictions.

For information Mr J White, Trelaske Livery Yard, Lewannick, Retention of mobile home on site of equestrian business has been refused.

Mr and Mrs D Cash – Erection of hydrotherapy unit, Bowden Derra Park, approved.

Mr I McCutcheon – erection of a replacement shed, Rose Cottage – approved.

The land near Sunnybank – Polyphant (CL393) confirmation that the fence has been removed, there is no longer a breach of Section 194 of the Law of Property Act 1925.... Removeable traffic cones do not fall within this section.

Cheques were paid to BJC (Cleaning of bus shelter – Lewannick) £22.00 and £70.00 D Eno for two months newsletters.

The Mobile Library service has been reviewed and some alterations to the stops in Lewannick parish have been made. The new timetable starts on the 27 March this year and the new times are contained within this newsletter.
