LEWANNICK PARISH COUNCIL

We met on Wednesday 21 September at Lewannick Village Hall. We have purchased a quality bench/table for the play area at Lewannick. Our Councillors are kindly securing this in situ. A dead tree has also been cleared within the play area at Lewannick by one of our Councillors. Repairs have been made to the fence around Polyphant Play Area and a check carried out on all the equipment. We have had no further movement with regard to the liaison committee for Blackhill Quarry and are in correspondence with them in this respect. We are also in correspondence regarding the amount of tipping that is happening at the quarry which is now visible from the A30. A further meeting with Highways has been requested with regard to the junction at Two Bridges. We have been successful in obtaining funding from the Aggregates Levy Sustainability Fund and have been awarded £4,294. A thorough report on the Green has now been carried out. A site meeting with our County Forester will now take place and following this an open meeting inviting all parishioners will be made. It is our intention to put back and protect this valued conservation area. There were no planning applications in for decisions. Planning applications have been approved for Lewannick Post Office - alterations to openings and raising of roof height of store room. Mr and Mrs D Cash - revised design to increase floor levels in accordance with DDA requirements special care assisted living unit. (1999/1421) and the appeal that was going to take place on the 5 September for Mr and Mrs D Cash - land at Bowden Derra has been withdrawn and no further action will be taken. Finally, we wish to remind landowners that road hedge sides need to

be trimmed in June and again in August leaving 200 - 300 run of growth. There are areas within the parish that have not been trimmed. If the hedges have not been trimmed we need to report the matter to Highways who would invoice landowners after they have carried out the work deemed necessary. Our next meeting will take place in Polyphant on Wednesday 18 October at 8pm. As always members of the public are welcome to attend.
