## Parish History

I recently went, together with Carol Bunbury, for a meeting at Cornwall County records office to ask for help in setting up a history project for Lewannick Parish. The idea we put forward is to create a substantial historical resource on our website - [www.lewannick.info](http://www.lewannick.info). We will be seeking both professional and amateur help in researching: 1. Places of interest eg chapels, church, monuments, historical sites, private houses (with owner's involvement) etc. 2. People and family histories. 3. Snapshots of parish life. eg what was here in 1500 or 1900? Memories of the first and second world wars and how it affected life here, etc. 4. History by topic eg food and farming, quarrying and minerals. 5. An on-line museum of exhibits.

We hope to present this in a novel and imaginative way, making it is accessible to all, including children. Our plans were met with enthusiasm and it was suggested that we could hold an event in the Village Hall to get people interested, with representatives from the County Records Office, Cornwall Family History Society, The Cornish Studies Library and The Cornish Audio Visual Archive who would demonstrate to us the wealth of information and sources that are available to us. We plan to hold this in November. We understand there are grants available to help with costs, so the only other thing we need is your interest, help and enthusiasm! Watch this space. *David*

## LEWANNICK PARISH COUNCIL

Lewannick Parish Council – we met at Polyphant Village Hall on Wednesday 18 July. A warm welcome was given to our new Councillor Bernard O'Neil from Trevadlock. Bernard is keen on promoting the welfare of senior citizens and we look forward to working with him in this respect and, of course, for his ideas and support within our Council in the future. An inspection of the green was taken prior to our meeting commencing at 8pm. Planning matters that were supported – 2007/01207 Listed Building Consent for works to the roof Rose Cottage, Polyphant. Planning 2007/01343 erection of agricultural dwelling, Trevadlock Farm, Mr and Mrs E G Sleep – in principle we do support the erection of an agricultural dwelling, however, we have objected to the design, scale and elevated position of the proposed property. Furthermore, we consider that it would have a detrimental impact on the character of the village and surrounding environment.

In view of remarks received regarding the length of time allotted to the public at the commencement of our meetings we have consulted with the Cornwall Association of Local Councils who have advised us that we can, if we wish, allow ten minutes for members of the public to speak only on matters listed in the agenda. If, on occasion, a further amount of time is required, this must be agreed within the council. Therefore, we would ask members of the public with concerns to let the clerk have them prior to the monthly meeting in order that they can be put on the Agenda. This should also help us to solve problems quickly. The CALC also added that we must keep in mind that the work of parish councils has increased substantially and that our meetings should not last longer than two hours. A resolution has also been passed and agreed unanimously that we display the Agenda no less than three clear days before our meeting and it is displayed in one venue only in each of the villages, namely Lewannick Post Office and Polyphant noticeboard. The Agenda will also be displayed on our website.

The roads in Polyphant have been patched but we have spoken to Highways about the standard of the work as it has done nothing to enhance the green. We have also had a site meeting at Kelly's
