Lewannick Parish Council News

We met at Polyphant Village Hall on Wednesday 21 January 2009. We were updated with regards to the trees to the conservation area, Polyphant. The works will be carried out during April. We have also requested our contractor to carry out works to the two damaged areas on the green that was recently caused by a lorry. Finally, we have asked our contractor to again look at the footpath by The Cottage, Polyphant, in order to ensure that it is accessible for pedestrians. We hope to soon have the new play equipment in situ at Polyphant (swing) and a new noticeboard for Lewannick, funding of which has been provided by the Aggregates Levy for which we are most thankful.

Planning which has been supported include 2008/02258 Bovetown Farm, Lewannick - erection of 16 affordable housing units and a doctors surgery on an exception site together with the conversion of 2 existing barns into dwellings, and a further two new private dwellings within the development boundary. 2009/02355 5 Penmay House, Bell Meadow, Lewannick for Mr Fred Werring. We have not supported 2009/0002 - erection of agricultural dwelling and garage together with barn and polytunnel LAND AT TRENHORNE Ms D Richardson. Finally for information 2008/02000 Mr E G Sleep - erection of an agricultural dwelling to include increase in conservatory size has been approved together with 2008/02053 Mr and Mrs J A and N M Foulds - erection of a two storey extension onto the north west elevation.

The information obtained from the questionnaires are extremely important on the development needs for our community.

Invoices paid included Perfect Pastures £1,578.38 (maintenance of common land and footpaths), £5.81 repairs to noticeboard - Polyphant and £315.00 for producing our newsletter (6 months).

Finally, following the inclement weather conditions it has been brought to our attention that in particular the roads leading into Lewannick School are not treated in time for the start of the school day. We have logged a request with Highways to have this altered.

Our next meeting is scheduled for Wednesday 18 February at Lewannick Village Hall. Members of the public are always welcome to attend. Our meetings unless otherwise stated always commence at 20.00 hours.

A Belated Thank You for all those concerned with the improved Christmas tree in Lewannick. The tree was donated by Mark, the lights were paid for by the Archer Arms Sunday quiz night and permission was kindly given by the church who allowed us to use their electricity. There was also a lot of help supplied by passing locals to erect the tree into the ground. We had a lot of good reaction to the new lights which are all LED so we are reducing the running costs and doing our bit to save the planet!

Well done to Mr. Towe and his Year 6 class from Lewannick School who participated in a sponsored litter picking day in Lewannick to help fund their school trip to London to visit the House of Commons. We now have a tidy village and a trip the children can look forward to.

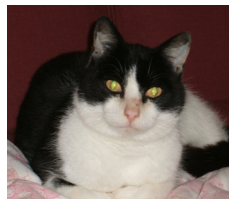
